ABUCOOP MICROFINANCE BANK LIMITED

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Abucoop Microfinance Bank Limited, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 December 2014, the income statement, statement of cash flows for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies, value added statement and other explanatory information set out on pages 4 to 24.

Directors' Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Directors are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the Companies and Allied Matters Act, Cap C20, LFN 2004, the Banks and Other Financial Institutions Act, Cap B3, LFN 2004, and the Regulatory and Supervisory Framework for Microfinance Banks in Nigeria issued by the Central Bank of Nigeria, and for such internal control as the Directors determine are necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditors consider internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of **Abucoop Microfinance Bank Limited** as at 31 December 2014, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended; the company has kept proper books of account, which are in agreement with the balance sheet and income statement, in the manner required by the Companies and Allied Matters Act, Cap C20, LFN 2004, and, in accordance with the Statements of Accounting Standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

We confirm that our examination of loans and advances was carried out in accordance with the Prudential Guidelines for licensed banks issued by the Central Bank of Nigeria.

Contraventions

During the year, the bank had no record of contravention of the provisions of the Banks and Other Financial Institutions Act, Cap B3, LFN 2004, as disclosed in the financial statements.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

The following are the statement of significant accounting policies consistently adopted by the Bank in the preparation of its financial statements.

1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by revaluation of certain investment securities, and comply with the Statements of Accounting Standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria (FRC), the requirements of the Companies and Allied Matters Act of Nigeria, the Banks and Other Financial Institutions Act of Nigeria, and relevant Central Bank of Nigeria guidelines and circulars

2. Cash and short term funds

Cash and short term funds comprise cash balances on hand, short term funds with Central Bank of Nigeria, and other local banks.

3. Investments

Short-term investments are investments that management intends to hold for not more than one year. Debt securities intended to be held for a period not exceeding one year are classified as short term investment.

Short term investments in treasury bills are stated at net realisable value and is presented net of unearned discount income. The gain/loss on revaluation is credited/charged to profit and loss account during the year.

Short term deposits are placements made with banks and other financial institutions. Provision is made for placements when they are doubtful of recovery.

4. Loans and advances

Loans and advances are stated net of provisions for non-performing loans. Provisions are determined in accordance with the Central Bank of Nigeria's Regulatory and Supervisory Framework for Microfinance Banks in Nigeria, from a specific assessment of each customer's account as stated below:

Period principal or interest has been outstanding:	Classification	% Provision required
Between 1 - 30 days	Pass and watch	5%
Between 31 - 60 days	Substandard	20%
Between 60 - 90 days	Doubtful	50%
91 or more days	Lost	100%

The Bank makes a general provision of 1% on all performing loans. Interest on loans and advances which are due and unpaid for more than 30 days are suspended.

5. Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

6. Depreciation

Depreciation on properties and equipment is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life at the following annual rates:

Gains/losses on disposal of fixed assets are included in the profit and loss account.

7. Other assets

Other assets comprise receivables and prepayments. Receivables are stated at cost, less allowance for bad and doubtful amounts. Subsequent recoveries are credited to the profit and loss statement.

Prepayments are carried at cost less amortised amounts.

8. Current taxation

Income tax expenses/credits are recognised in the profit and loss accounts. Current income tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using statutory tax rates at the balance sheet date.

9. Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation which arises from timing differences in the recognition of items for accounting and tax purposes is calculated using the liability method. Deferred taxation is provided fully on timing differences, which are expected to reverse at the rate of tax likely to be in force at the time of reversal.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that is probable that the future taxable income will be available against which the associated unused tax losses and deductible temporary differences can be utilized. Deferred tax assets are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

10. Income recognition

Interest income is accrued monthly on all interest-bearing assets except for interest on past due microfinance loans, which is recognized on a cash basis.

Microcredit-related fees are spread systematically over the tenor of the credit facility where they constitute at least 10% of the projected average annual yield of the facility; otherwise they are credited to profit and loss account at the time of occurrence.

Investment income is recognised on an accrual basis and credited to the profit and loss account.

11. Foreign currency items

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into Naira at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are reported at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Any gain or loss arising from a change in exchange rates subsequent to the date of the transaction is included in the profit and loss accounts.

12. Retirement benefits

The Bank operates a defined contribution pension scheme in accordance with the Pension Reform Act 2004. The contributions of 7.5% each of both staff and the bank are based on current salaries and designated allowances. Employees' contributions are funded through payroll deductions while the bank's contribution is charged to the profit and loss account

13. Expenses

All expenses are recognised in the profit and loss account on an accrual basis.

14. Dividend

Dividend on ordinary shares are appropriated from retained earnings and recognised as a liability in the period in which they are declared. Dividend that are proposed but not yet declared are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

15. Earnings per share

The Bank presents basic earnings per share for its ordinary shares. Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the profit or loss attributable to ordinary shareholders of the Bank by the weighted number of ordinary shares adjusted for any bonus shares issued

16. Segment reporting

A segment is a distinguishable component of the Microfinance Bank that is engaged either in providing related products or services (business segment), or in products or services within a particular economic environment (geographical segment), which is subject to risks and returns that are different from those of other segments.

Segment information is presented in respect of the Microfinance Bank's business and geographical segments, where applicable. The Microfinance Bank primary format for segment reporting is based on business segments. The business segments are determined by management based on the Microfinance Bank's internal reporting structure

Segment results, assets and liabilities include items directly attributable to a segment as well as those that can be allocated on a reasonable basis.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

1 The Bank

a. Legal form

Abucoop Microfinance Bank was incorporated on 13 November, 2009 as a private limited liability company. The Bank was granted approval to operate as a Microfinance Bank by the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) on 10 March 2010 and commenced operations in that same month. The Microfinance Bank is a subsidiary of NNPC Staff Coperative Society Limited.

b. Principal activity

The principal activity is to carry on the business of microfinance banking.

2 Data migration to Finance Solution System, and contingent liabilities

The Bank migrated from LENS Application System to Finance Solution System on 1st August 2014. The Directors are optimistic that the final resolution of the teething problem usually associated with adoption of a new system like this will not have significant impact on these financial statements. Furthermore, the Bank's Solicitors was unable to provide information on the position of the Bank's contingent liabilities as at 31 December 2014 (See Note 28).
